Achievements include the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Developing a regulatory structure that differs from other states. Implementing programming to meet the goals of the MRTA in innovative ways. Advancing the Seeding Opportunity Initiative starting the New York cannabis industry with family farms and local hemp processors. Licensing Conditional Adult-Use Retail Dispensaries. Activating the initial cannabis supply chain from seed to sale. Chair Wright commented that the Board will be considering three Conditional Cultivators and six Conditional Processors for licensure today. |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Resolution No. 2021-01D is amended to permit Board Member Jessica Garcia to hold the public office of New York State Agriculture Health & Safety Advisory Board Member, in addition to the public offices previously approved by the Board. |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Office of Cannabis Management completed the review of and recommended an additional three applicants for an Adult-Use Conditional Cultivator License to the Board. Board Member Reuben McDaniel asked that on the cultivator side if OCM was going to keep this open enrolling for perpetuity. Executive Director Chris Alexander noted that OCM has been working with the applicants for this license to make sure all proper documentation has been submitted and will keep this open while OCM closes out that process. The Cannabis Control Board voted unanimously to approve Resolution No. 2022-51, a Resolution Issuing Certain Conditional Adult-Use Cultivator Licenses. |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Office of Cannabis Management completed the review of and recommended an additional six applicants for an Adult-Use Conditional Processor License to the Board. |



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- The Cannabis Control Board voted unanimously to approve Resolution No. 2022-52, a Resolution Issuing Certain Conditional Adult-Use Processor Licenses.
- Executive Director Chris Alexander provided his Executive Director's Report.
 - Proposed Adult-Use Regulations Open for Public Comment
 - The proposed regulations are posted in the State Register.
 - Comments on the regulations can be submitted on the OCM website.
 - Illicit Market Enforcement Update
 - Last week, Executive Director Chris Alexander joined Mayor Adams to announce the results of an initial joint enforcement effort with the NYC Sheriff Department where more than \$4 million worth of illicit cannabis product was seized from fifty-three different locations across the city.
 - OCM led enforcement actions are underway throughout the state. OCM has made clear that these stores represent a threat to public health by selling untested product.
 - Governor Unveils Dispensary Verification Tool
 - The Dispensary Verification Tool will be posted in the windows of legally licensed retail dispensaries to ensure consumers know they are buying from a dispensary regulated by New York State. Consumers will be able to scan the barcode and confirm that the operation is licensed and is selling products that have been tested. A similar tool will be made available for delivery websites.
 - The state will also be launching a public education campaign called "Why Buy Legal New York," which will also help inform New Yorkers and to transition them into supporting the regulated market.
 - Extending Cannabis Laboratory Testing Application
 - The Office is extending the Cannabis Laboratory Testing Application deadline from December 31, 2022 through March 31, 2023.
 - The permit application is available on the OCM website.
 - CAURD Update
 - Earlier this month, OCM issued guidance for provisionally approved CAURD licensees to jumpstart their sales with delivery.
 - Last week, OCM held a webinar with provisionally approved licensees with the Dormitory Authority to help them understand the next steps in the process.
 - The first legal Adult-Use retail sales will take place on December 29th at a dispensary being opened by Housing Works, a nonprofit organization in New York City. This organization is the nation's largest minority-controlled HIV/AIDS service organization and one of the largest community-based HIV/AIDS service organizations. This non-profit operates a range of direct and support services for people living with HIV and AIDS, the homeless, formerly incarcerated and justice involved individuals.



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- Today is Board Member Jen Metzger’s last meeting where she will be serving as a member of the Cannabis Control Board. Board Members thanked Board Member Metzger for her service and leadership as an inaugural member of the Cannabis Control Board and stewardship of environmental protection for the new cannabis industry. Board Member Metzger will officially depart the board when she is sworn into as the County Executive for Ulster County effective January 1, 2023.
- Board Member Jen Metzger commented that her heart is full of gratitude to State Senator and Majority Leader Andrea Stewart-Cousins for giving her the extraordinary opportunity to serve, as well as to Chair Wright and her board colleagues, to Executive Director Chris Alexander, Chief Equity Officer Damian Fagon and the truly amazing staff at OCM that she had the incredible honor and pleasure to work with. Board Member Jen Metzger commented that serving on the Board has truly been some of the most rewarding and gratifying work that she has done in her so far long life. She noted that helping to build a legal industry from the ground up that centered on principles of equity, public health and sustainability and that the opportunity to be part of something like this does not come along really ever. Board Member Metzger thanked her board colleagues and staff for their commitment and dedicated service to implementing the Marijuana Regulation and Taxation Act and the extraordinary vision of its sponsors, Majority Leader Crystal Peoples-Stokes and Senator Liz Krueger. She also pointed out that Ulster County has the lowest opt-out rate in the entire state.
- Board Member Reuben McDaniel asked now that the regulations are posted what is the closing date.
- Executive Director Chris Alexander noted that it is 60 days from posting.
- Board Member Reuben McDaniel commented that he would like to request that Chair Wright talk to the AG’s office about getting outside counsel to get by-laws for the Board.
- Members of the public were provided the opportunity to address the Board during the Public Comment period. Each member of the public addressing the Board has pre-registered and will be allotted two minutes to speak. The Board will hear from as many as ten members of the public. Public Comments are listed in Appendix A.
- Chair Wright asked for a motion to enter into Executive Session to discuss specific personnel matters and specific litigation, which include Variscite New York One v. New York State Hudson Health Extracts LLC, The Zucker CC of New York, the Department of Health, New York Medical Growers LLC, the New York State Department of Health. Board Member Reuben McDaniel moved the motion to enter into Executive Session and Board Member Jen Metzger seconded. There was no action taken during Executive Session.
- The Board adjourned the meeting.
