## RESOLUTION TO EXTEND THE PROVISIONAL LICENSE PERIOD FOR ADULT-USE LICENSEES

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Article 4 of the Cannabis Law, the Cannabis Control Board (Board) is charged with the responsibility of overseeing activities related to adult-use cannabis;

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Sections 10(4), 10(16), 13, 85(12) and 89 of the Cannabis Law, the Board has the authority to establish standards and requirements, and to promulgate rules and regulations, governing the cultivation, processing, packaging, marketing and sale of adult-use cannabis;

**WHEREAS**, the Board has promulgated and adopted regulations creating the Adult-Use Retail Dispensary license under Parts 118, 119, and 123 of Title 9 of the New York Code, Rules and Regulations;

**WHEREAS**, the Board and Office have issued provisional licenses to adult-use applicants who are eligible for the license in accordance with Part 120 of Title 9 of New York Codes, Rules and Regulations;

**WHEREAS**, 9 NYCRR §120.9(c) states that “an applicant shall submit all outstanding information required for final operational license approval within twelve (12) months of receiving a provisional license unless otherwise approved by the Board”;

**WHEREAS**, due to litigation related to the adult-use program in Organic Blooms, LLC, et al., v. The New York State Office of Cannabis Management, et al, (Index No. 904497-24), the Board was unable to issue or process adult-use licenses for a period of time;

**WHEREAS**, the Office is recommending to the Board an additional six (6) month extension of the provisional license period for adult-use provisional licensees to provide further time to submit outstanding information required for final license approval as a result of such litigation delays;

**RESOLVED**, the Board agrees with the Office’s recommendation to extend the provisional license period for provisional adult-use licensees who were issued a provisional license before February 1,2025, for an additional six (6) months, therefore the provisional license period for these adult-use provisional licensees shall expire eighteen (18) months from the date an adult-use applicant was approved for provisional licensure.
