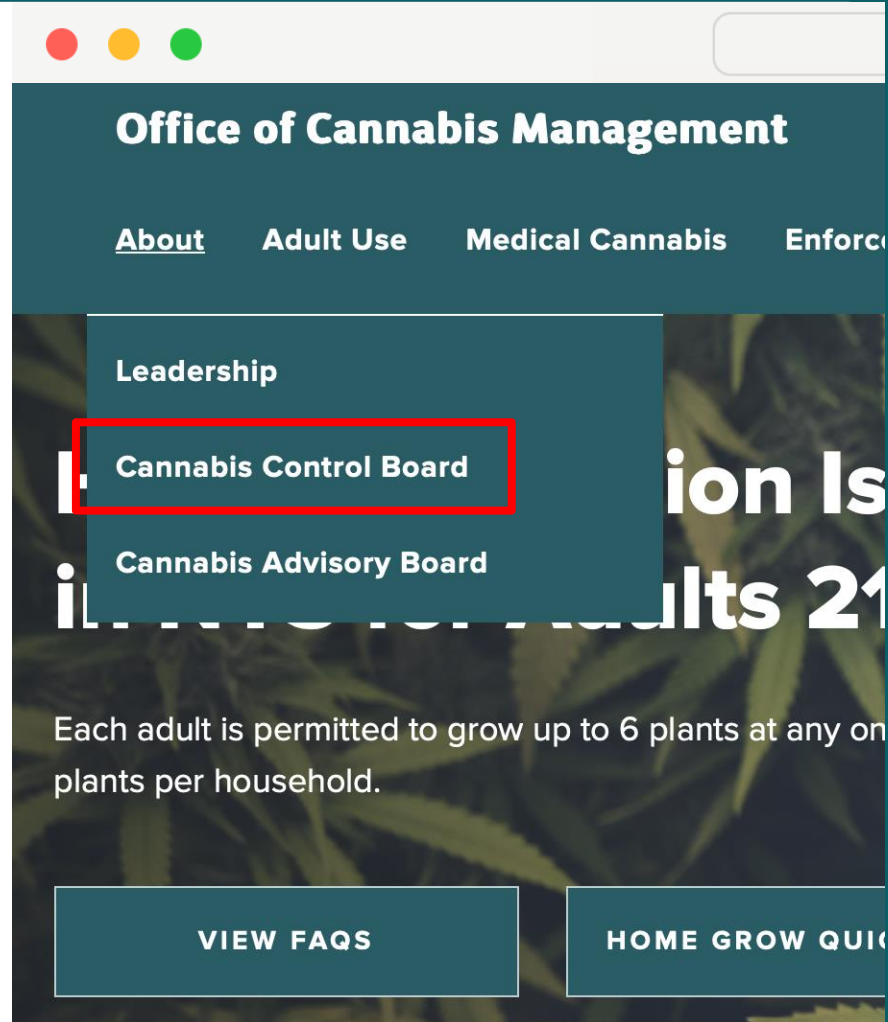

DENIALS DISCUSSION

CONSIDERATION OF ADULT-USE CANNABIS LICENSES FOR APPROVAL

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-20

- On October 4, 2023, OCM opened an application window for adult-use licenses. The application window included applications for cultivators, processors, distributors, retail dispensaries and microbusinesses.
- The application window closed on November 17, 2023, for retail and microbusiness applications who were applying with a location. The remaining applications closed on December 18, 2023. Overall, nearly 7,000 applications were received.
- **28 AU applications** are being recommended for approval today and all have satisfied the necessary requirements in accordance with the Cannabis Law and regulations.
- The Office is actively reviewing and issuing additional adult-use licenses on a rolling basis. If the Office has been in contact with you, please respond to any deficiency letter with the requested information to keep your application processing.

CONSIDERATION OF ADULT-USE LICENSE AND PERMIT AMENDMENT REQUESTS

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-21

- **Sections 13(1), 67(2), 126(1), and 129 of the Cannabis Law** allow the Board to authorize amendments to cannabis licenses and permits. Sections 120.18(d)(1)(iii), 132.9(9)(ii), and 130.7(f) of Title 9 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations outline the criteria for such amendments.
- The Office of Cannabis Management launched an amendment survey on August 27, 2024, which allows adult-use cannabis licensees to request certain amendments including location or cultivation tier changes which require Board approval in accordance with the cannabis regulations. The Office has begun the review of amendments submitted and will be reviewing requests on a rolling basis.
- For the applications listed in the attached resolution, the Office is recommending approval. The licensees have provided all necessary information in accordance with the cannabis regulations.

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-24

- Pursuant to **Section 130-a(13) of the Cannabis Law**, the Board is charged with promulgating regulations to implement cannabis showcase events and any necessary permitting or applications to be filed with OCM.
- In May 2025, the Board passed Resolution 2025-040, directing OCM to file a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking proposing the addition of a new **Part 117 to Title 9 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations** relating to cannabis showcase event permits.
- The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking was publishing in the New York State Register on September 24, 2025 for a 60-day public comment period.
- OCM has reviewed and assessed the public comment received in response to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking and recommends a set of minor changes as listed in the attached resolution.

CONSIDERATION OF MODIFICATION TO CERTAIN REGISTERED ORGANIZATION FEE

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-25

- Pursuant to **Section 35 of the Cannabis Law**, the Board has authority to set fee amounts by regulation or modify the factors the Board shall consider prior to registration of a Registered Organization (RO).
- Pursuant to **Section 113.7(c) of Title 9 of the New York Codes, Rules, and Regulations**, the registration fee for ROs is set at \$200,000, which may be modified by the Board in consideration of the “nature and scope” of the business of the applicant.
- OCM recommends that when a RO has previously paid the \$200,000 registration fee under **9 NYCRR 113.7(c)** and subsequently applies for renewal of their registration, the registration fee shall be reduced to \$20,000.
- Many ROs are already paying application and license fees under their ROD or ROND license.

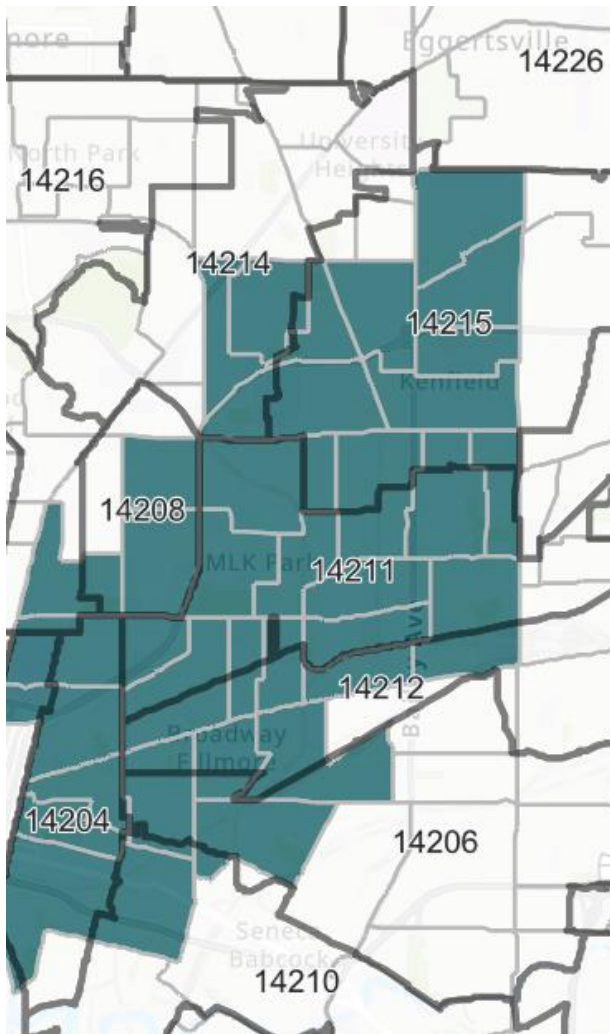

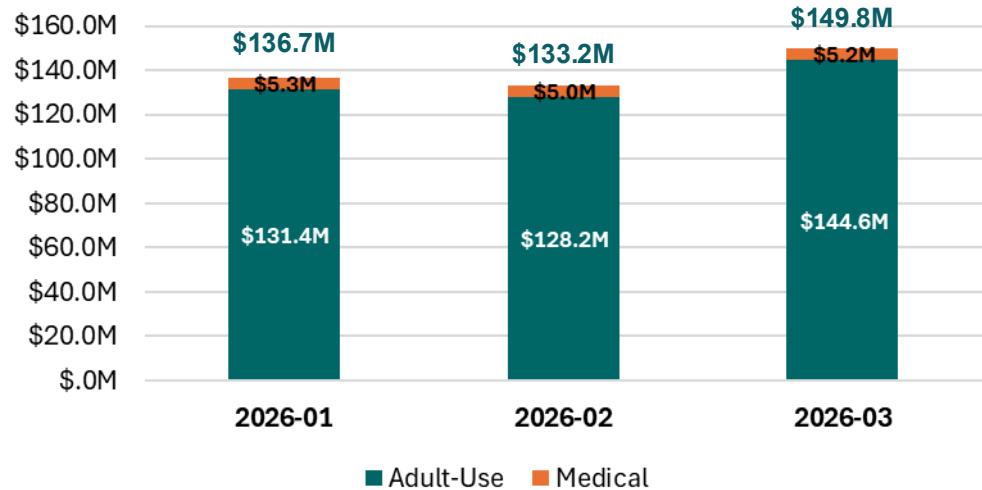

SOME REPORTING CHANGES:

- Officially using STS data for market updates (!). Data for Jan '26 onward will be from STS system.
- Monthly reporting will now be based on calendar month, not 4-week groupings.
- Team is working to restore longitudinal views and develop additional reporting modules.
- We are still in learning mode. This transition will be an iterative process.

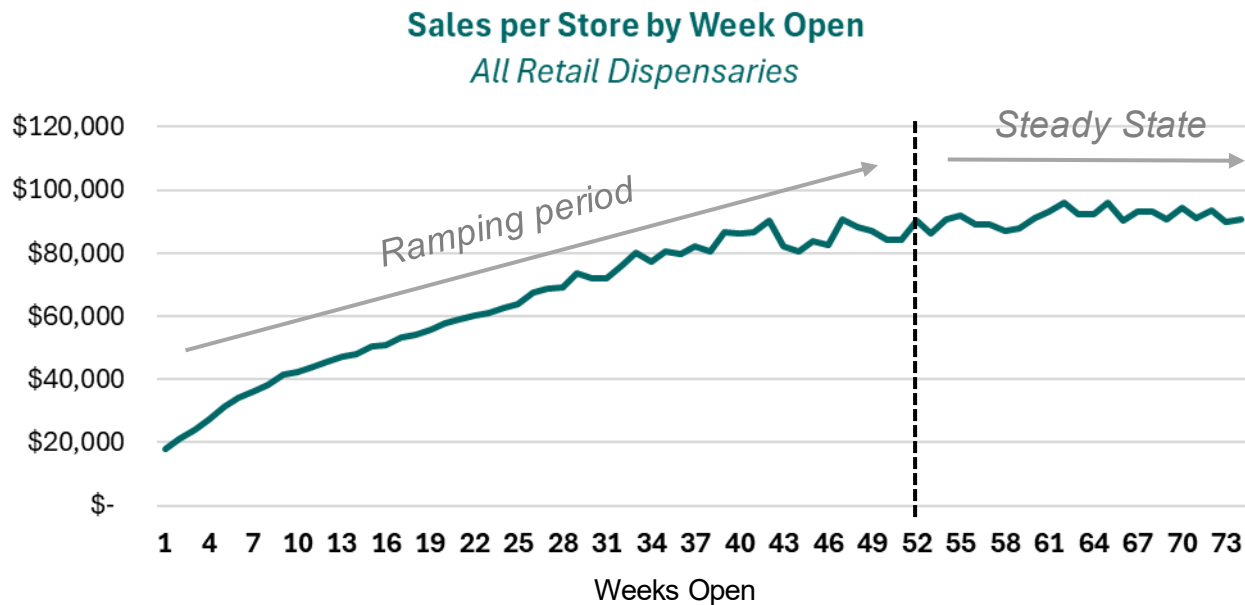

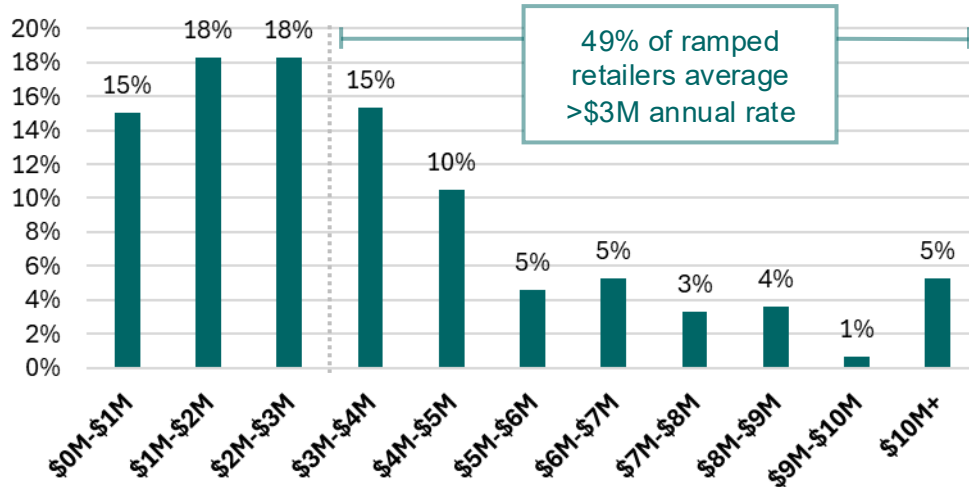

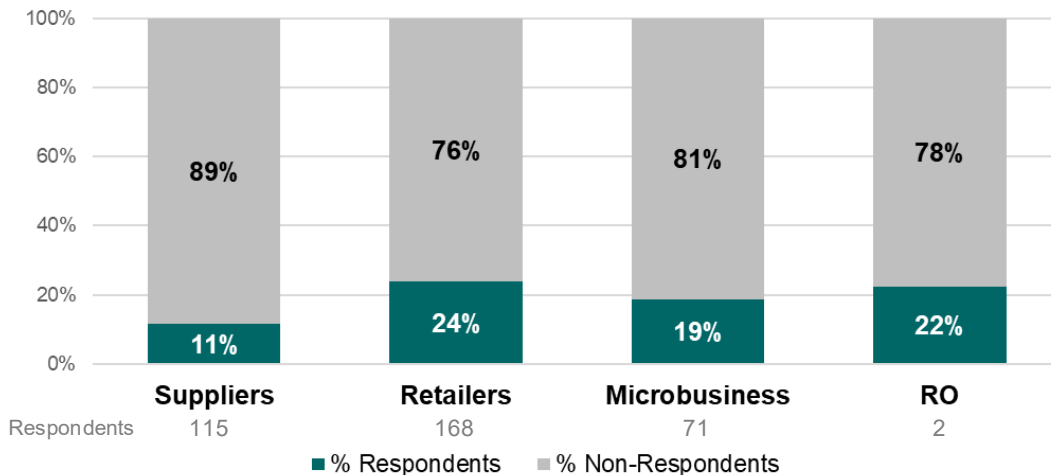

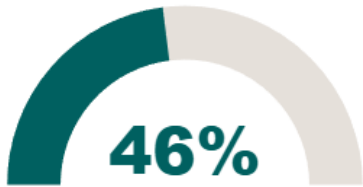

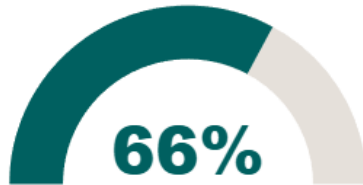
Positive Industry Outlook

All Respondents



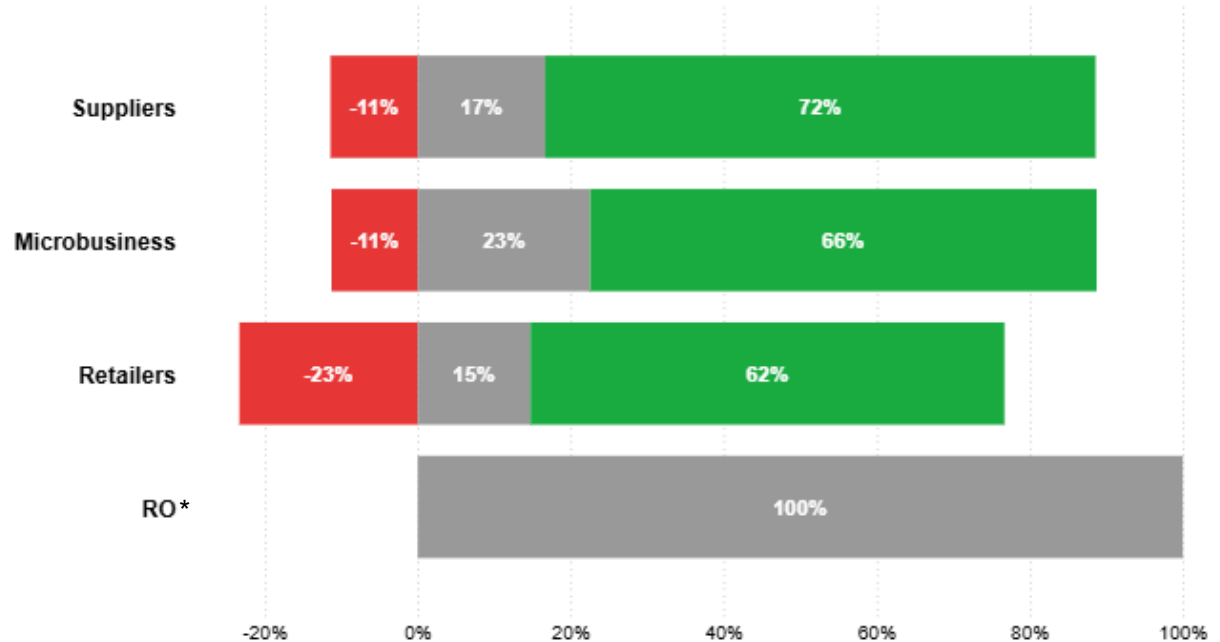

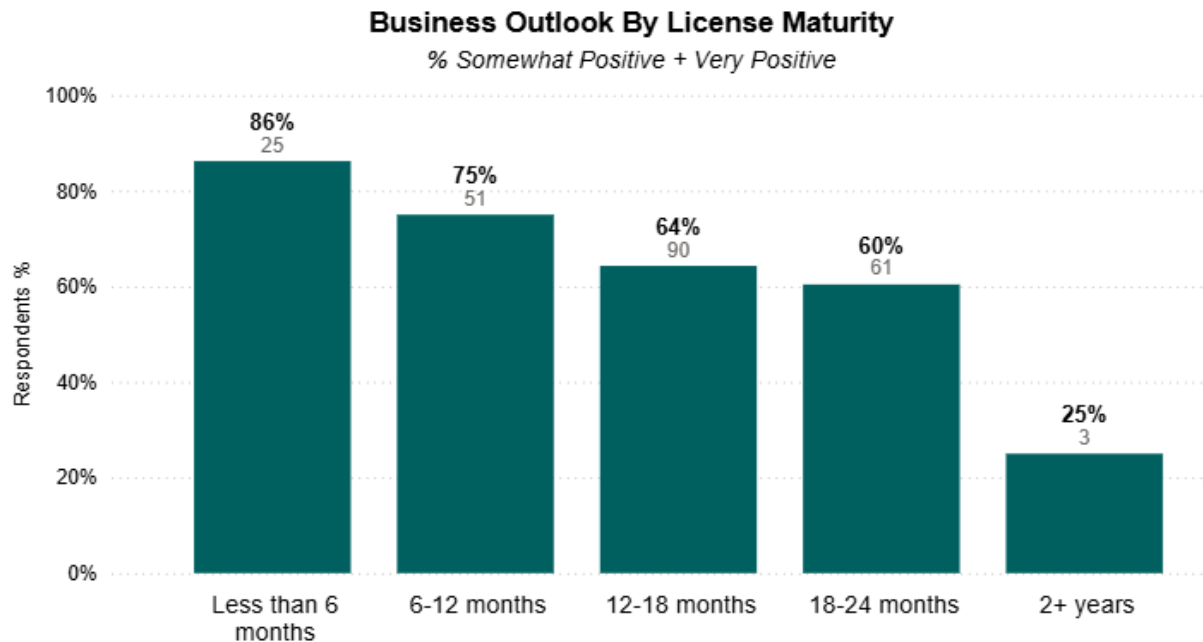
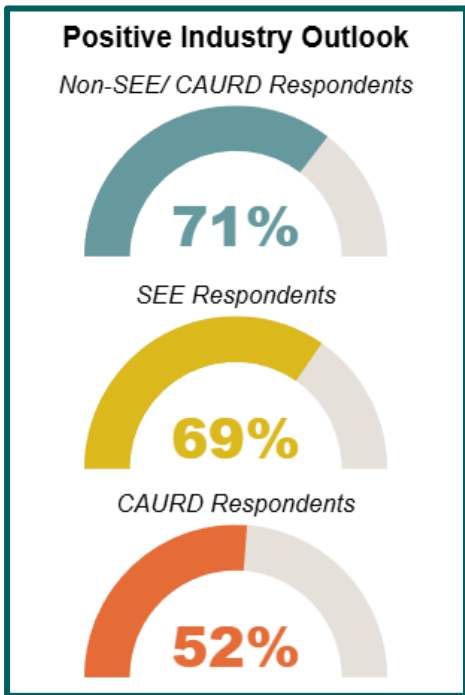
Business Outlook by License Group

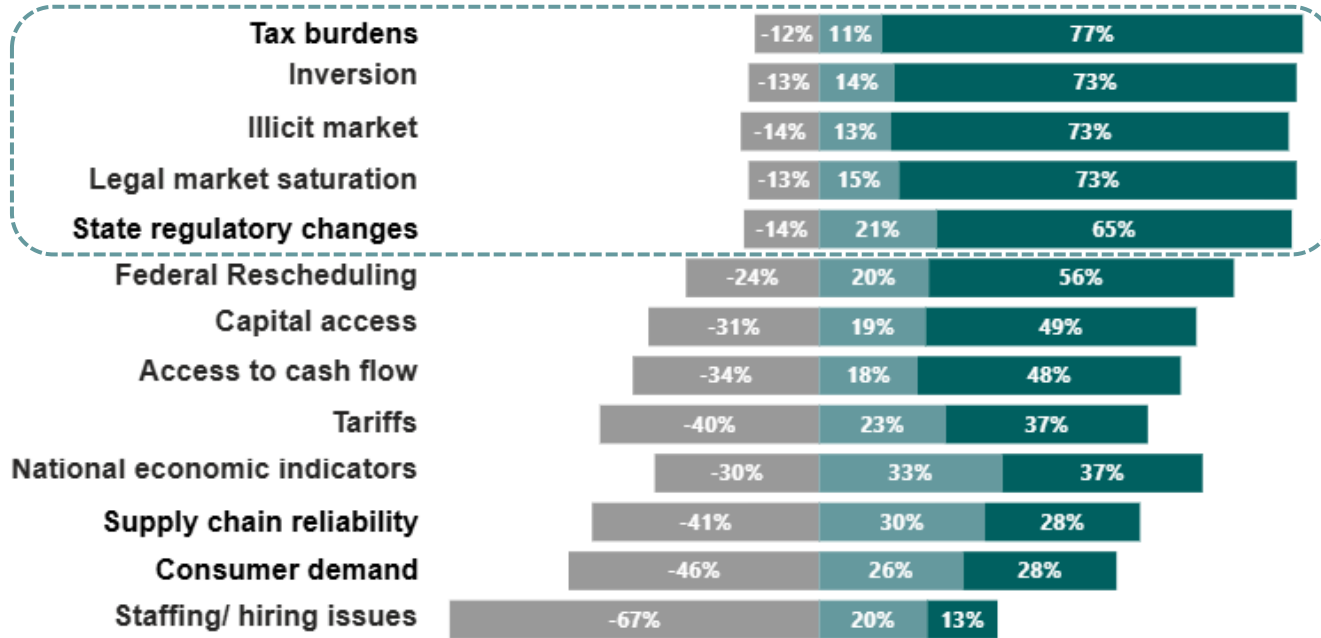

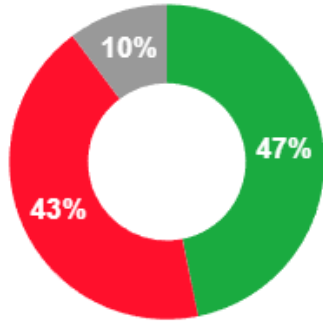

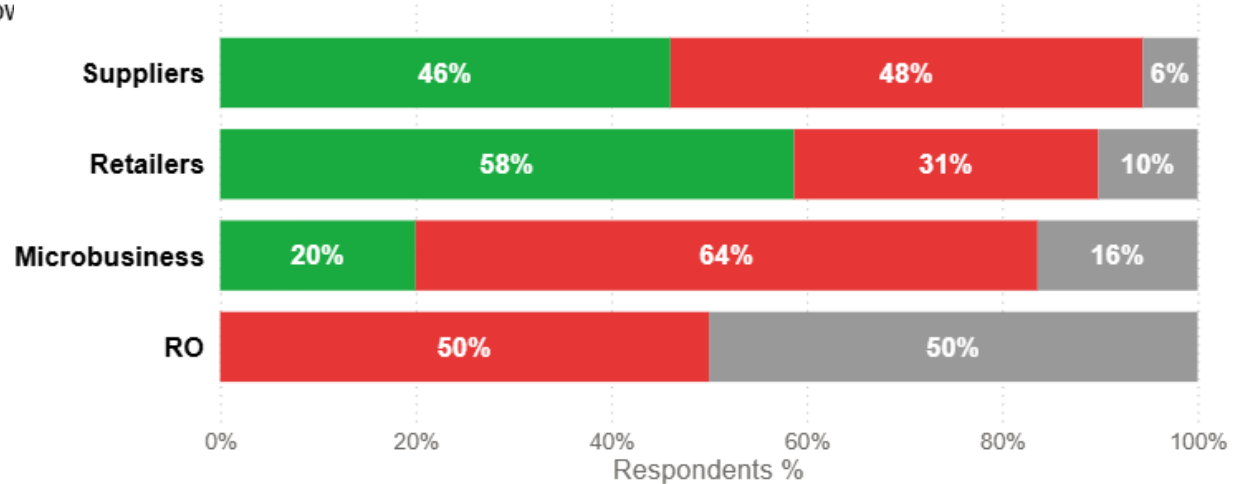

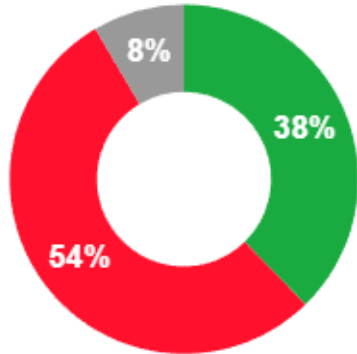

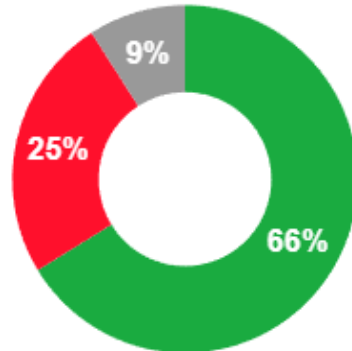
Profitability Comparison

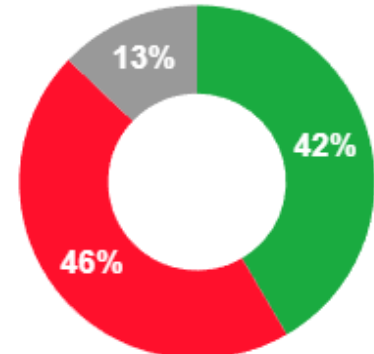

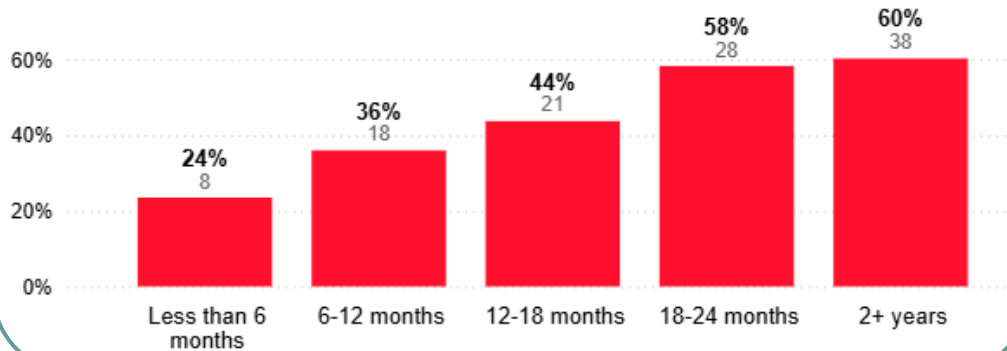

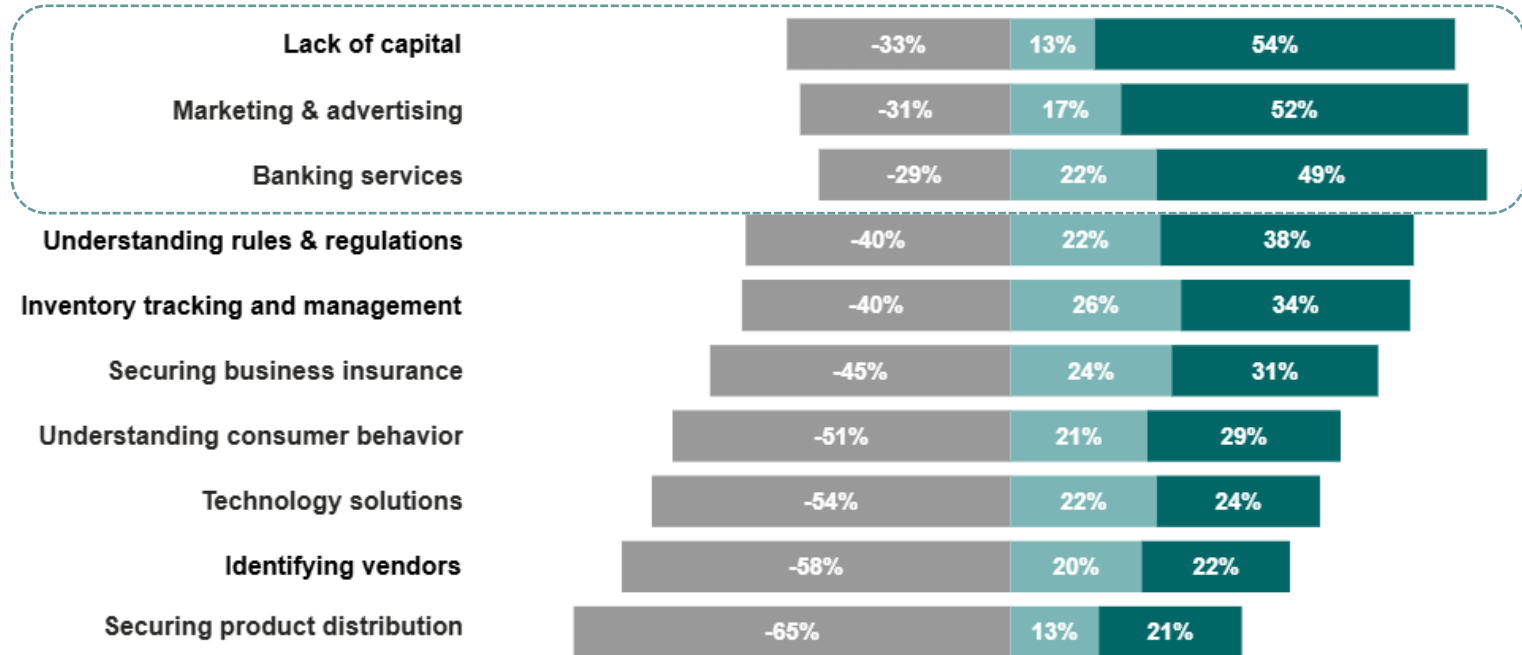

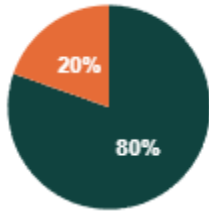

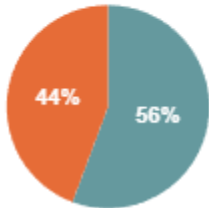

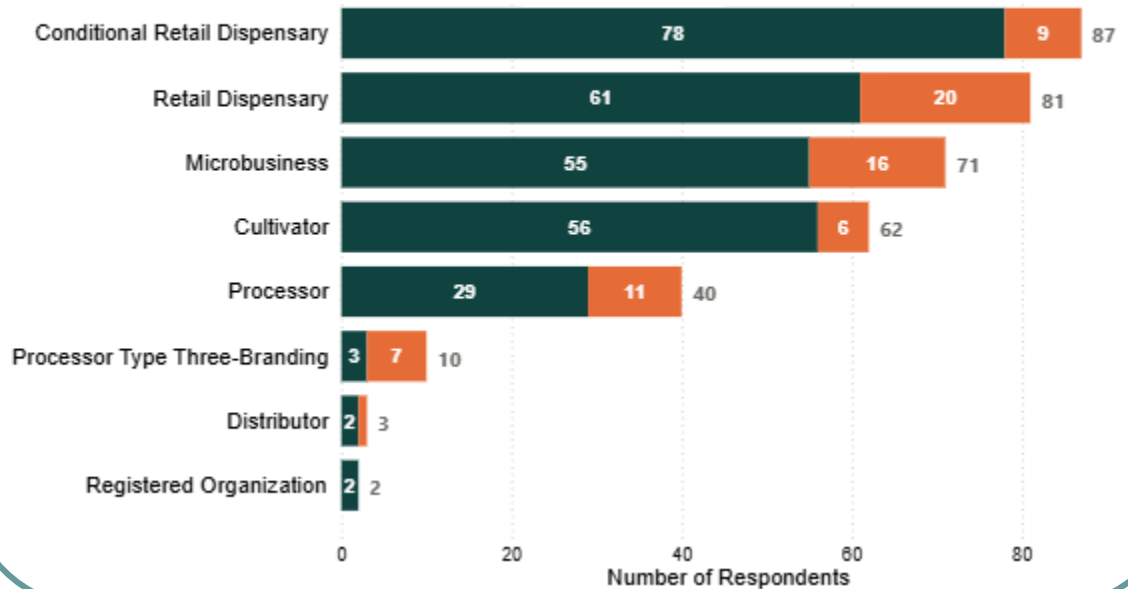

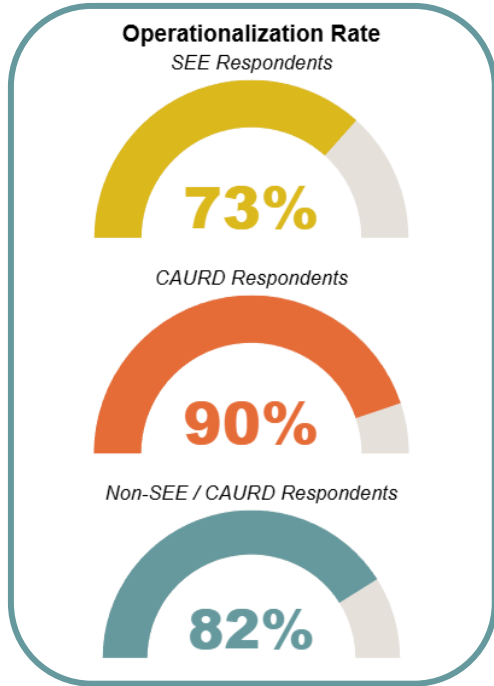
Respondent Operational Status

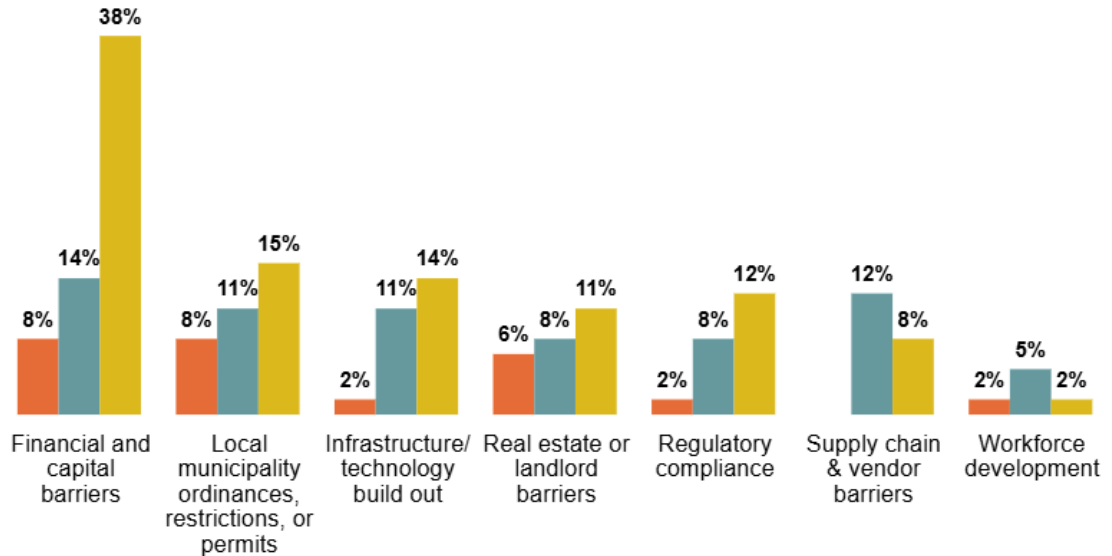

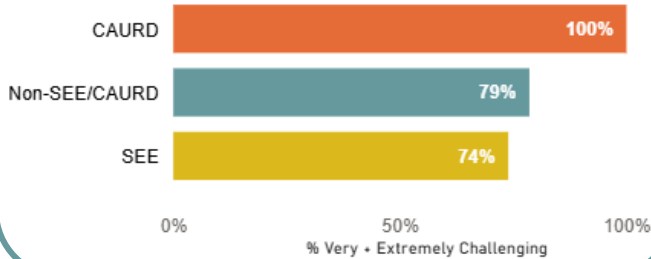

Non-Operational by SEE/ CAURD Status

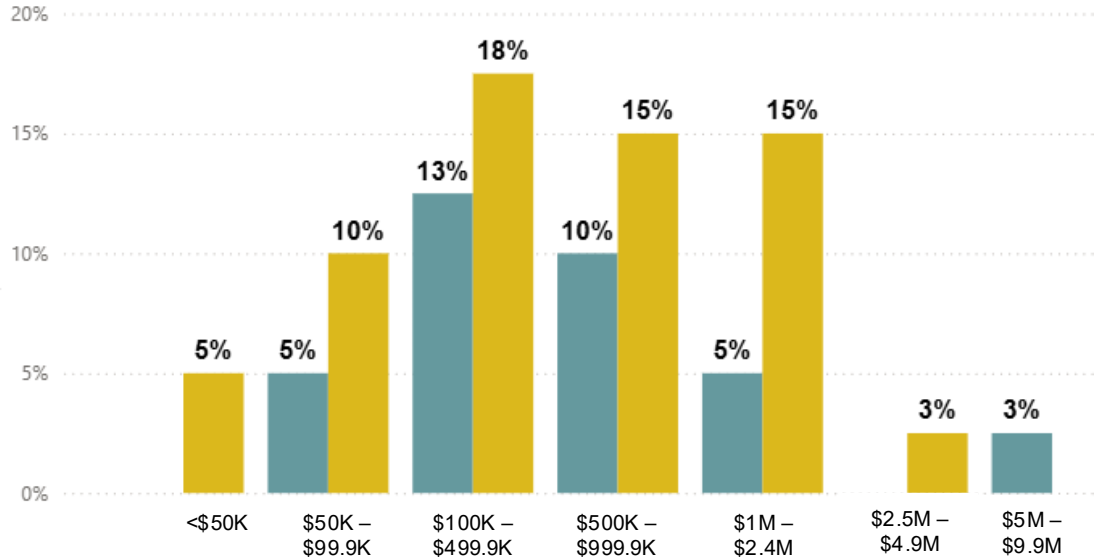

KEY FINDINGS FOR NEW YORK CANNABIS MARKET

- New York's cannabis market demonstrates resilience- most respondents are operational, adapting, and confident in their own business outlook amid broader market challenges
- Financial health varies among respondents with reported profitability variation, margin compression, and lack of capital impacting daily operations and business outlook
- SEE respondents indicated lowest profitability and highest barriers to operationalization while CAURD respondents were less optimistic about business outlook despite higher profitability ratings
- Top barriers respondents identified- tax burdens, inversion, illicit and legal market competition- are all areas where policy action can potentially improve conditions
- In an effort to continue to collect information on the market and support evidence-based decision making, the Financial Health survey will be launching soon for licensees to participate in

- Remarks must be limited to **2 minutes or less** to allow all participants an equal amount of time to speak.
- Reminder to adhere to key Code of Conduct principles: **Maintain Decorum, Keep it Timely, Keep it Relevant, and Address the Body.**
